INVITATION FOR PRE-QUALIFICATION AND LICENSING OF FIRMS / COMPANIES / CONTRACTORS FOR THE PROCUREMENT, HANDLING, & STORAGE OF WHEAT

The Ministry of National Food Security & Research (MNFSR), Government of Pakistan, invites applications from private Firms / Companies / Contractors / Joint Ventures (JVs) / Consortiums for licensing to provide procurement, handling, storage, and related operational services for wheat under GOP's Interim National Wheat Policy 2025-26.

Pre-qualification is open to all eligible national entities acting individually or as part of a joint venture, consortium, or association, duly registered with the relevant authorities in Pakistan. Local firms in JV or consortium with foreign partners must comply with all applicable requirements under the laws of Pakistan before execution of the resultant contracts at the RFP stage.

MNFSR is committed to conducting all procurement activities in a fair, transparent, and competitive manner. The Ministry reserves the right to accept or reject any or all applications without assigning any reason.

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1. Background and Purpose

The purpose of this PQD is to identify qualified private entities that will be licensed by MNFSR to undertake wheat procurement, handling, and storage operations. The private companies that will be granted operational licenses through this process will be invited to participate in the subsequent Request for Proposals (RFP) stage.

This initiative constitutes a key operational measure under the Interim National Wheat Policy 2025–26, which introduces a market-oriented and performance-based wheat procurement framework. The Government of Pakistan, through MNFSR, aims to progressively transition from a state-dominated wheat procurement model to a competitive, private sector-enabled mechanism, wherein licensed firms will undertake wheat procurement, storage, and management on behalf of MNFSR and provincial governments through transparent, accountable, and technology-driven processes.

Through this process, MNFSR seeks to grant licenses to multiple companies that possess adequate technical, financial, and logistical capacity to ensure the timely and reliable procurement of wheat for the formation and maintenance of national strategic reserves of 1.5 million metric tons for 2025-26 across various regions of the country. These reserves will cover a one-year cycle, aligned with the annual crop harvesting period. Upon completion of each cycle and subject to approval by MNFSR and relevant authorities, licensed firms may be allowed to release or sell the existing stocks and initiate fresh procurement for the following year. This rolling mechanism will enable continuity in market operations, efficient stock rotation, and enhanced food security management.

The economic and social impacts of this initiative are expected to be far-reaching. A transparent, efficient, and competitive wheat procurement system will:

- i. Encourage private investment in agriculture, logistics, and grain storage infrastructure;
- ii. Reduce the fiscal and administrative burden associated with public sector wheat procurement and stockholding;
- iii. Improve price stability and market predictability, thereby reducing volatility for both producers and consumers;
- iv. Create employment and income-generating opportunities across the value chain including transport, warehousing, and trading activities; and
- v. Enhance national food security and macroeconomic stability by aligning domestic wheat markets with international best practices and minimizing post-harvest losses.

Through this initiative, MNFSR reaffirms the Government of Pakistan’s commitment to a transparent, competitive, and farmer-centric wheat procurement system that upholds national food security, enhances rural livelihoods, and supports sustainable economic growth under robust public oversight and accountability mechanisms.

2. Brief Scope of Services

This document outlines only the preliminary scope of services. The comprehensive technical, financial, and operational scope will be detailed at the RFP stage, which will be issued exclusively to firms that obtain licenses under this process.

3. Objective of Tendering

The MNFSR intends to engage capable private sector firms to undertake the procurement, storage, and handling of wheat in alignment with the Government’s food security policy and national reserve management objectives.

Licensed firms (“Contractor” or “Service Provider”) will operate on behalf of MNFSR and, where applicable, provincial food departments, to ensure that wheat is procured, handled, and stored efficiently, transparently, and in accordance with MNFSR’s prescribed standards. These firms will be responsible for maintaining and managing designated wheat stocks as part of the national strategic reserves, ensuring quality, safety, and traceability throughout the supply chain.

4. Description of Services

The successful companies will be responsible for performing, managing, and supervising all activities necessary to achieve the objectives listed below. All services shall be carried out under MNFSR’s supervision and in accordance with approved operational frameworks and national food security standards. The following sections will be detailed in the RFP under scope of services section:

- a. **Procurement Operations**
- b. **Handling, Storage and Warehousing**
- c. **Quality Control and Food Safety**
- d. **Reporting and Data Management**
- e. **Compliance and Legal Obligations**
- f. **Maintenance and Facility Management**

5. Lot Structure and Allocation Framework

The total national strategic requirement of 1.5 million metric tons (MMT) of wheat would be divided into 150 separate lots of 10,000 MT each. This model is intended to broaden private sector participation by creating more opportunities for licensed firms of varying capacities to compete for manageable lots. Each successful firm would be required to independently finance, procure, handle, and store the minimum of 10,000 MT allocated to it. However, during the RFP stage, a firm may bid for more than one lot, subject to its demonstrated financial, technical, and storage capacity. The maximum number of lots that a successful bidder may be awarded will be determined and conveyed during the RFP stage.

6. Pre-Qualification Evaluation Requirements

The evaluation criteria for this process are based on the applicant’s relevant experience, technical, financial strength. Detailed evaluation parameters are provided in Section III (Evaluation Criteria) of this document.

SECTION I: INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANTS

1. Preparation and Submission of Prequalification Application

1.1 Language

The Application and all related correspondence and documents shall be written in English. Supporting documents or printed material in any other language must be accompanied by duly certified English translations, which shall prevail for interpretation.

1.2 Application Preparation Costs

All costs associated with the preparation and submission of the Application, including any costs incurred in responding to clarifications or additional information requests, shall be borne solely by the Applicant. MNFSR shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible or liable for such costs regardless of the outcome of the prequalification process.

1.3 Requirements of Application Documents

- i. The Application shall comprise all documents, forms, and annexures specified in Section III of this document.
- ii. All information provided by the Applicant shall be legally binding, and MNFSR reserves the right to verify the authenticity of any information submitted, at its sole discretion and cost.
- iii. As per PPRA Rules, all documents and statements submitted under this process are considered under oath. Any falsified, misstated, or fraudulent information discovered at any stage, before or after prequalification, shall result in immediate disqualification and blacklisting of the firm or consortium, and the names of such entities shall be published on the PPRA website.
- iv. Any Applicant determined to have engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, or collusive practices shall be disqualified and subject to sanctions in accordance with the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 and relevant blacklisting regulations.
- v. The Application shall not contain any fee, cost, or rate information. Any application including such details shall be rejected outright.
- vi. Applicants must submit the following information:
 - a. Legal name, address, ownership details, registration certificate, and incorporation year;
 - b. Corporate group structure (if applicable), with details of subsidiaries, parent entities, or affiliates;
 - c. Organizational structure and staffing pattern for the last three (3) years;
 - d. In case local firms having consortium or JV with foreign companies, proof of registration or authorization to operate within Pakistan must be furnished before execution of resultant contract(s) in responsibility of local firm acting as lead contractor;
 - e. Current tax registration details with FBR and other relevant authorities;
 - f. Annual turnover and financial summary for the last three fiscal years;
 - g. Audited financial statements of the last three years, including notes;
 - h. Demonstrate availability of covered warehouses or silos (owned or leased) with a minimum storage capacity of 10,000 MT, suitable for food-grade bulk wheat storage; and
 - i. Demonstrate the establishment of a functional laboratory capable of performing inspection, moisture testing, and related quality-control activities.

1.4 Format and Signing of the Application

- i. Each Applicant shall submit its Application electronically via E-PADS (<https://eprocare.gov.pk>)
- ii. The Application shall be signed by a person duly authorized to bind the Applicant, with each page of the original forms, annexures, and supporting documents bearing the company's official stamp and initials.
- iii. All pages of the Application shall be sequentially numbered.
- iv. Any correction, overwriting, or amendment shall be countersigned by the authorized signatory. Applications with unauthorized alterations may be rejected.

1.5 Sealing and Marking of Prequalification Applications

- i. Applications shall be submitted exclusively through E-PADS.
- ii. No hard copies shall be accepted by MNFSR.
- iii. All forms and annexures must be uploaded in the prescribed format through the portal before the deadline specified in the Schedule of Prequalification Process.

1.6 Prequalification Application Due Date

- i. Prequalification Applications must be submitted electronically via E-PADS no later than 11:00 AM (PST) on the closing date specified in this document.
- ii. MNFSR may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for submission by issuing an addendum on E-PADS. In such a case, all prior rights and obligations shall remain valid, subject to the new extended deadline.

1.7 Late Prequalification Applications

Applications submitted through E-PADS after 11:00 AM (PST) on January 14, 2026 shall not be considered under any circumstances.

1.8 Modification, Substitution, or Withdrawal of Prequalification Application

- i. An Applicant may modify, substitute, or withdraw its Application through E-PADS, provided such notice is received before the submission deadline.
- ii. Any modification, substitution, or withdrawal request must be submitted electronically.
- iii. Applications withdrawn or modified after the deadline will not be entertained.

1.9 Contents of Prequalification Application

The Applicant must upload all compliance documents, duly completed and supported by documentary evidence. Missing or incomplete documentation may render the application non-responsive and disqualified from further evaluation.

1.10 Updating Prequalification Information

Applicants shall be required to update their financial, personnel, and infrastructure information at the time of bid submission to confirm continued compliance with prequalification requirements. Failure to maintain the required qualification standards at the time of bidding may result in rejection of the bid and disqualification from subsequent processes.

SECTION II: PREQUALIFICATION OPENING AND EVALUATION

2.1 Opening of Applications

MNFSR will open all applications electronically through the E-PADS portal on the submission closing date and time specified in the Schedule of Prequalification Process.

A record of the opening shall be automatically generated by E-PADS, showing at a minimum:

- i. The name of each Applicant,
- ii. Date and time of submission, and
- iii. Confirmation of successful electronic receipt.

2.2 Evaluation of Prequalification Applications

MNFSR will examine and evaluate the Prequalification Applications in accordance with the evaluation criteria outlined in Section III of this document. The evaluation shall be conducted by an Evaluation Committee constituted by MNFSR and approved by the Competent Authority (the Secretary, MNFSR, or an authorized officer).

2.3 Verification and Supporting Documents

MNFSR reserves the right to seek clarification or supporting documentation to verify any information provided by an Applicant at any stage of evaluation. Applicants shall provide the requested clarification or documents within seven (7) days of such request. Failure to comply may result in zero scoring for the respective criterion or disqualification if the missing information is deemed essential for evaluation.

2.4 Clarification Requests by Applicants

Prospective Applicants may seek clarification through the E-PADS portal only regarding any aspect of this Prequalification Document. Such requests must be submitted before the clarifications request deadline mentioned in this document. MNFSR will issue clarifications or amendments, if deemed necessary, through E-PADS, and these will form part of the Prequalification Document.

2.5 Right to Accept or Reject Applications

MNFSR reserves the right to accept or reject any or all applications, or to annul the Prequalification process at any time, even after evaluation, without assigning any reason and without any liability. This will be done in accordance with Rule 33 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 (as amended).

2.6 Confidentiality

All information relating to the evaluation and qualification of Applicants shall be treated as confidential. MNFSR and its officials shall not disclose any details of the evaluation process or recommendations until the publication of prequalification results. However, MNFSR reserves the right to verify any or all information submitted by Applicants from relevant organizations, departments, or third-party sources as necessary to validate credentials, experience, financial strength, or compliance.

2.7 Notification of Prequalified Applicants

Upon completion of the evaluation, MNFSR shall publish the list of licensed Applicants on the E-PADS portal and on the MNFSR website. Simultaneously, Applicants who do not qualify shall be notified electronically through E-PADS. All licensed Applicants shall subsequently be invited to participate in the Request for Proposals (RFP) stage.

2.8 Multiple Contracts to Be Awarded by MNFSR

MNFSR intends to enter into multiple parallel contracts with licensed firms for the procurement, handling, storage, and related services required for maintaining national wheat strategic reserves, with the final number of contracts to be awarded determined by operational requirements, geographical coverage, provincial needs, storage capacity, logistical distribution networks, and overall national food security considerations. The enlistment as licensed firm does not guarantee contract award, and only those Applicants who meet all qualification thresholds and subsequently submit the Most Advantageous Bid (MAB) at the RFP stage, evaluated strictly in accordance with the Public Procurement Rules, 2004, will be considered for the award of contract(s).

2.9 Final RFP Evaluation

The final evaluation under the RFP stage shall be based on the criteria specified in the Request for Proposals, and MNFSR shall award contracts only to those Applicants whose proposals are determined to be the Most Advantageous Bids, consistent with the PPRA Rules, 2004.

SECTION III: ELIGIBILITY & EVALUATION CRITERIA

The enlistment of Applicants shall be carried out based on the eligibility and evaluation criteria mentioned below.

3.1 Eligibility

The following essential requirements must be met to establish eligibility:

- i. **Country Eligibility:** The Lead Applicant shall be a firm incorporated and registered in Pakistan. Pakistani firms may participate either on a standalone basis or in the form of a consortium or joint venture with one or more international firms. Any international firm participating as a consortium or joint venture partner shall be incorporated in a country that maintains diplomatic and commercial relations with the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and shall not be subject to any restriction, sanction, or prohibition under the prevailing laws, rules, or policies of the Government of Pakistan. The consortium or joint venture shall designate a Pakistani firm as the Lead Applicant, who shall be responsible for compliance with the requirements of this Prequalification Document.
- ii. **Legal Standing:** The Applicant must be a legally registered entity (company, partnership, firm, or joint venture) under the laws of Pakistan, authorized to conduct business in Pakistan.
- iii. **Non-Blacklisting:** The Applicant (including any partner, affiliate, or subsidiary) must not be debarred, suspended, or blacklisted by any federal, provincial, or local government department or any international financing institution.
- iv. **Conflict of Interest:** Applicants must declare that no conflict of interest exists in accordance with PPRA Rules.
- v. **Tax Registration:** The Lead Applicant shall be a firm incorporated and registered in Pakistan and shall possess a valid National Tax Number (NTN) and Sales Tax Registration (where applicable) issued by the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR). In the case of a consortium or joint venture, the Pakistani Lead Applicant shall be solely responsible for ensuring that all consortium or joint venture partners, including any foreign entities, comply with the applicable statutory, tax, and regulatory requirements of Pakistan. Failure to comply with these requirements shall render the consortium or joint venture ineligible for award of the resultant contract.
- vi. **Litigation Disclosure:** Applicants must disclose all pending or past litigation, arbitration, or contractual disputes with any public or private entity within the last five years.
- vii. **Document Attestation:** Documents executed outside Pakistan must be duly attested by the competent authority or the Embassy of Pakistan, as applicable.
- viii. **Joint Ventures:** JVs or Consortiums must submit a legally binding agreement specifying the role and share of each partner.

Failure to meet any of the above criteria may result in automatic disqualification.

3.2 General Requirements

- i. Submissions must be complete and responsive to all requirements specified in this document.
- ii. MNFSR reserves the right to verify the authenticity of any information provided.
- iii. Experience and resources of sub-contractors shall only be considered if they are formally part of the Applicant's team through a binding commitment or joint venture.

- iv. Applications containing financial offers, quotations, or rate information shall be rejected.
- v. MNFSR may, at its discretion, waive minor deviations that do not materially affect the Applicant's capability to perform the services.

3.3 Evaluation Criteria (Framework)

The evaluation for the licencing during the PQ stage shall be based on the following two (2) main categories:

- A. Financial Strength and Stability**
- B. Technical and Operational Capacity**

Applicants must satisfy the following minimum criteria to be eligible for licensing and to advance to the subsequent stage of the process.

A. Financial Strength and Stability:

Annual turnover must not be less than PKR 1.00 billion, based on the average annual turnover for the last three (03) audited financial years. Firms submitting financial statements in a foreign currency must present the equivalent value in PKR, converted at the official SBP interbank exchange rate as of the application submission date. Evidence must be supported through audited financial statements and a currency conversion sheet

B. Storage and Laboratory Services

- i. **Adequate Storage & Warehousing Capacity:** Ability to demonstrate availability of covered warehouses or silos (owned or leased) with a minimum storage capacity of 10,000 MT, suitable for food-grade bulk wheat storage.
- ii. **Laboratory Services:** Ability to demonstrate the establishment of a functional laboratory capable of performing inspection, moisture testing, and related quality-control activities.

3.4 Evaluation Methodology

- i. Each application will be reviewed for completeness and compliance with eligibility and evaluation criteria.
- ii. Only eligible and substantially responsive applications will proceed to technical evaluation.
- iii. The Committee will apply a pass/fail assessment across evaluation factors, and bidders must clearly demonstrate full compliance with each capacity requirement. Passing all evaluation factors is a mandatory condition for obtaining a license and proceeding to the next stage.
- iv. MNFSR reserves the right to seek clarifications or additional documentation during evaluation.

3.5 Disqualification Grounds

An Applicant shall be disqualified if:

- i. It provides false, misleading, or incomplete information;
- ii. It fails to submit mandatory documentation;
- iii. It is found to have engaged in corrupt, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices;
- iv. It is in breach of confidentiality or attempts to influence the evaluation process.

3.6 Updating of Information

At the time of bid submission (RFP stage), enlisted Applicants shall be required to update their information to confirm continued compliance with the prequalification criteria. Failure to maintain qualification thresholds may lead to disqualification at the bidding stage.
